Swami Shraddhanand

Swami Shraddhanand, also known as Mahatma Munshi Ram Vij, was an influential Indian Independence activist and a dedicated sanyasi of Arya Samaj. He ardently propagated the teachings of Dayananda Saraswati, focusing on various endeavors such as establishing educational institutions like Gurukul Kangri University. Additionally, he played a pivotal role in the Sangathan (consolidation and organization) and Shuddhi (re-conversion) movements, which aimed to reform Hindu practices during the 1920s. Born on 22 February 1856 in Talwan, a village located in the Jalandhar District of the Punjab Province in India, he was the youngest child of Lala Nanak Chand. During his tenure as a Police-Inspector in the United Provinces (now Uttar Pradesh), he served under the administration of the East India Company. In 1917, he embraced sanyas.



In 1902, he established a reputed Gurukul in Kangri, India, located near Haridwar. This institution eventually evolved into the renowned Gurukul Kangri University. However, in 1917, he left his role at Gurukul to actively participate in the Hindu reform movements and the struggle for Indian Independence. Sadly, his illustrious life was tragically cut short on 23 December 1926 when he was assassinated by a man named Abdul Rashid. Today, the "Swami Shraddhanand Kaksha" at the archaeological museum of Gurukul Kangri University in Haridwar commemorates his life through a captivating photographic journey. Following India's independence, a statue of Swami Shraddhanand was erected in front of Delhi Town Hall, symbolically replacing the statue of Queen Victoria. This gesture honored his significant contributions to the nation and served as a reminder of his unwavering dedication to the cause of freedom and reform.

Disciplinary Control and Academic Regulations Discipline

The Proctorial Board and Anti-Ragging Committees play a crucial role in fostering a healthy and safe environment within the college. These committees are dedicated to addressing student concerns and have the authority to adjudicate cases involving breaches of discipline. It is important for students to be aware that the following behaviors will be considered as disciplinary infractions:

- 1. Neglecting assigned tasks and class work.
- 2. Disrupting classes and causing disturbances.
- 3. Showing defiance towards teachers or any other college authority.
- 4. Engaging in misconduct within the classroom, leading to damage to furniture or college property.
- 5. Inciting others to create trouble or engage in disruptive activities.
- 6. Shouting and loitering on the college premises.
- 7. Leaving classes without permission.
- 8. Smoking or drinking within the college premises.
- 9. Diverting buses from their designated routes is a severe offense and will result in strict disciplinary action, which may include expulsion from the college.
- 10. Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited as per the University of Delhi Ordinance XV-C, which states:
 - Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited within the premises of the college and any part of the university system as well as on public transport.
 - Any individual or collective act or practice of ragging constitutes gross indiscipline and shall be dealt with severity under this ordinance.
 - Ragging ordinarily means any act, conduct, or practice by which dominant power or status of senior students is brought to bear on students freshly enrolled or students who are in any way considered junior or inferior by other students and includes individual or collective acts or practices which:
 - (a) involve physical assault, threat, or use of physical force;
 - (b) violate the status, dignity, and honor of women students;
 - (c) violate the status, dignity, and honor of students belonging to the Scheduled Castes and Tribes;
 - (d) expose students to ridicule and contempt that affect their self-esteem;
 - (e) entail verbal abuse and aggression, indecent gestures, and obscene behavior.

National Education Policy (NEP) 2020

An education system rooted in Indian ethos that contributes directly to transforming India, thatis Bharat, sustainably into an equitable and vibrant knowledge society, by providing high-quality education to all, thereby making India a global knowledge superpower.

The curriculum and pedagogy of our institutions must develop a deep sense of respect towards the fundamental duties and Constitutional values, bonding with one's country, and a conscious awareness of one's roles and responsibilities in a changing world. To instill a deep-rooted pride in being Indian, not only in thought, but also in spirit, intellect, and deeds, as well as to develop knowledge, skills, values, and dispositions that support responsible commitment to human rights, sustainable development, and living, and global well-being, thereby reflecting atruly global citizen.

The aim will be to increase the Gross Enrolment Ratio in higher education including vocational education from 26.3% (2018) to 50% by 2035. The policy envisages a broad-based multi-disciplinary holistic education at the undergraduate level for integrated, rigorous exposure to science, arts, humanities, mathematics, and professional fields having imaginative and flexible curricular structures, creative combinations of study, integration of vocational education, and multiple entry/exit points. A holistic and multidisciplinary education will help develop well-rounded individuals who possess critical 21st-century capacities in fields across the arts, humanities, languages, sciences, social sciences, and professional, technical, and vocational fields; an ethic of social engagement; soft skills, such as communication, discussion, and debate; and rigorous specialization in a chosen field or fields. Such a holistic education shall be, in the long term, the approach of all undergraduate programs, including those in professional, technical, and vocational disciplines.

The undergraduate degree will be of either 3 or 4-year duration, with multiple exit options within this period, with appropriate certifications- a certificate after completing 1 year in a discipline or field including vocational and professional areas, or a diploma after 2 years of study, or a Bachelor's degree after a 3-year program. The 4-year multidisciplinary Bachelor'sprogram shall be the preferred option since it allows the opportunity to experience the full range of holistic and multidisciplinary education in addition to a focus on the chosen major and minors as per the choices of the student. An Academic Bank of Credit (ABC) shall be established which would digitally store the academic credits earned from various recognized HEIs so that the degrees from an HEI can be awarded taking into account credits earned.

A number of initiatives will be taken to ensure optimal learning environments are created thatare engaging and supportive, and enable all students to succeed. All institutions and faculty will have the autonomy to innovate on matters of curriculum, pedagogy, and assessment within a broad framework of higher education qualifications that ensures consistency across institutions and programs and across the ODL, online, and the traditional 'in-class' modes. HEIs shall move to a criterion-based grading system that assesses student achievement basedon the learning goals for each program, and also move away from high-stakes examinations towards more continuous and comprehensive evaluation.

Universities and colleges will set up high-quality support centers and will be given adequate funds and academic resources to encourage and support students from socio-economically disadvantaged backgrounds. Professional academic and career counseling will be available toall students, as well as counsellors to ensure physical, psychological, and emotional well-being.

The following objectives of NEP are kept in perspective while framing UGCF:

- 1. To promote each student's holistic development in both academic and non-academic spheres.
- 2. To provide flexibility to students so that learners have the ability to choose their learningtrajectories and programs, and thereby choose their paths in life according to their talents and interests.
- 3. To eliminate harmful hierarchies among disciplines/fields of study and silos between different areas of learning; multidisciplinary and holistic education to ensure the unity and integrity of all knowledge.
- 4. To promote creativity and critical thinking and to encourage logical decision-making and innovation; to promote ethics and human & Constitutional values
- 5. To promote multilingualism and the power of language in learning and teaching.
- 6. To impart life skills such as communication, cooperation, teamwork, and resilience.
- 7. To promote outstanding research as a corequisite for outstanding education and development.

- 2. The applicant should have passed the Class XII examination of any Board/University examination in India or any foreign country recognized as equivalent to the 10+2 system by the Association of Indian Universities (AIU).
- 3. The candidate must have studied and passed Class XII Examination or its equivalent from a single recognized board.
- 4. In case the subject studied at Class XII is not mentioned in the CUET, the candidate must appear in the subject that is similar/closely related to the subject s(he) has studied at Class XII. 5. Candidate must appear in CUET in only those subjects in which s(he) has passed Class XII.
- 6. Merit will be based only on the 'combination of subjects in which a candidate has appeared in CUET as mentioned in the respective Program-Specific Eligibility.
- 7. Only the scores obtained in CUET 2023 will be considered for academic year 2023-23 admissions.
- 8. Admissions to all programs will be done through a Centralized e-counselling procedure. To minimize the number of rounds of counselling, and to start the academic session timely, the University may explore the possibilities of admitting candidates over and above the sanctioned.
- 9. Applicants with gap year(s) will not be at any disadvantage for admission to undergraduate courses.

RESERVATION POLICIES

Reservation of Seats for Scheduled Caste (SC) and Scheduled Tribe (ST)Candidates

- 1. 22.5% of the total numbers of seats is reserved for Candidates belonging to Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribes (15% for Scheduled Caste and 7.5% for Scheduled Tribes, interchangeable if necessary).
- 2. The Candidate must be in possession of the Caste/Tribe certificate in his/her own name at the time of Registration and Admission. The Caste certificate should clearly state:
 - a) Name of his/ her caste/ tribe
 - b) Whether candidate belongs to SC or ST
 - c) District and the State or Union Territory of Candidate's usual place of residence, and
 - d) the appropriate Govt. of India Schedule under which his/ her caste/ tribe isapproved as SC or ST.
- 3. Candidate will have to produce the valid original SC or ST caste/tribe certificate at the time of admission. The following are empowered to issue the requisite SC / ST certificate:
 - a) District Magistrate/ Additional District Magistrate/ Collector/ Deputy Commissioner/ Addl. Deputy Commissioner/ Deputy Collector/ 1st class Stipendiary Magistrate/ City Magistrate/ Sub-Divisional Magistrate/ TalukaMagistrate/ Executive Magistrate/ Extra Assistant Commissioner.
 - b) Chief Presidency Magistrate/ Addl. Chief Presidency Magistrate/ Presidency Magistrate.
 - c) Revenue Officer, not below the rank of Tehsildar.
 - d) Sub-Divisional Officer of the area where the Candidate and/ or his family normally resides.
 - e) Administrator/ Secretary to the Administrator/ Development O□cer (Lakshadweep Islands).

Reservation of Seats for Other Backward Classes (OBC, Non-Creamy Layer, CentralList)

- 27% seats are reserved for the Candidates belonging to Other Backward Classes (OBC - Non-Creamy Layer, Central List).
- 2. At the time of giving admission to an OBC Candidate, the College will ensure that thecaste is included in the Central List of OBC (the OBC status is to be determined on thebasis of the Central (Govt. of India) List of OBCs notified by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment on the recommendations of the National Commission for Backward Classes (available at the website http://ncbc.nic.in/backward classes/index.html)
- 3. The certificate must mention non-creamy layer status of the Candidate (Noncreamy layer status issued by an authority mentioned in DOPT O□ce Memorandum no. 36012/22/93- Estt. (SCT) dated 15.11.1993).

4. The OBC Candidates who belong to the 'Non-Creamy Layer' and whose caste appears in the Central List of the OBCs only, shall be eligible to be considered for admission under the OBC category (Validity period of OBC certificate in respect of 'non-creamy layer' status of the candidate as per DOPT O□ce Memorandum No. 36036/2/2013-Estt. (Res- I) dated 31 March 2016). The certificate should be issued on or after 31st March,2022.

Reservation policy for Economically Weaker Sections (EWS)

As per the University of Delhi notifications (Reference No. Aca. I/ Reservation of EWSs/2019/63 Dated 28th March 2019 and Reference No. Aca. I/ Reservation of EWSs / 2019/101 Dated15th May 2019), for the reservation for Economically Weaker Sections (EWSs) Category, theUniversity Departments/ Centres/ Colleges have reserved 10% seats for admission of candidates belonging to EWS category.

Admission to Supernumerary Seats

Admission to all supernumerary seats will be through CUET 2022. Candidates desirous of taking admission on Supernumerary seats must appear in CUET 2022.

1. Reservation of Seats for Persons with Benchmark Disabilities (PwBD)

- a) Candidates with physical disabilities pursuing various programs of study shall be exempted from payment of fees, including examination fee and other University fees, except Admission fee, subscription towards Delhi University students' Union and Identity Card fee (As per amendment to Ordinance X(4) of the University).
- b) PwBD Candidates who meet the merit for the unreserved category and will take admission in the unreserved category (UR) will pay the fee relevant for PwBD Candidate.

2. Reservation for Children/Widows of Personnel of the Armed Forces (CW)

- a) Five percent (5%) of seats are reserved for Candidates under this category, program-wise.
- b) Candidates desirous of taking admission under the CW quota of the University must appear in CUET 2022.

3. Reservation of Kashmiri Migrants (KM)

- a. Up to 5% seats are reserved program-wise for the wards of Kashmiri Migrants.
- b. Candidates desirous of taking admission under the Kashmiri Migrants quota mustappear in CUET 2022.

4. Prime Minister's Special Scholarship Scheme for J&K students

Candidates desirous of taking admission under the Prime Minister's SpecialScholarship Scheme for J&K students must appear in CUET 2022.

5. Ward Quota of Employees of University of Delhi

a. Candidates desirous of taking admission under the Ward Quota of Employees of University of Delhi must appear in CUET 2022.

- b. Admission to the wards of University and its College employees, both teaching and non-teaching will be done as per Academic Council resolution 9a & 9b dated 27.11.2020 and subsequent amendments thereof.
- c. Candidates must be in possession of a valid Employment Certificate issued by dueofficials at the time of admission.

6. Extra-Curricular Activities (ECA) and Sports Quota

- a. Candidates desirous of taking admission under the supernumerary quota for ECA and/or Sports must appear in CUET 2022.
- b. For admissions to ECA and Sports supernumerary seats a weightage of 25% will be given to CUET score and 75% to certificates/trials/performances.
- c. As per the university guidelines of reserving 5% of the sanctioned seats for sports/cultural and extracurricular activities, the seats under extra-curricular activities shall be divided equally between six categories: (i) Dramatics, (ii) Dance,

(iii) Poetry, (iv) Painting, (v) Debates & Declamations, and (vi) Singing. These seats will further be divided between B.A. (Program), B.A. (Honours), B.Sc.(Program), and B.Sc. (Honours), B.Com. and B.Com. (Honours) on the basis of5% of total seats sanctioned for the different streams and subjects.

When a student proposes to withdraw his/her admission from the college, he/she is required to write an application to the principal intimating the date of withdrawal.

Rules for refund

Refund of fees will be permitted as per the University rules.

Financial Assistance/ Scholarship to Students

Students Aid Fund

The objective of this fund is to render financial assistance to deserving students to enable themto deposit their tuition/ examination fees or to purchase books. It also runs a Book Bank having10,000 books which are lent to the students on loan.

Fee Concession and Prizes

- 1. Fee concession is given to a few students on the basis of merit and individual needs.
- 2. Students belonging to the Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes are awarded scholarships by the Ministry of Education. Such students are required to applyto "The Secretary, Scheduled Castes/Tribes and the Backward Classes Board, Govt. of India" on prescribed form, through the principal, immediately after joining the college.
- 3. Prizes are given to students for academic distinction in University Examinations and for distinguished performance in debates and other cultural activities. College sports colors areawarded to sportsmen wining distinction at inter-college meets.

Identity Card

Every student will be issued an Identity Card. The students are required to keep their Identity Cards and produce the same on demand. Students will have to deposit the Identity Card to the college office while claiming back their securities. In case of lossof Identity Card, the students shall have to deposit Rs.100, and produce a copy of the FIR from the concerned Police Station and also submit an affidavit to this effect for getting a duplicate Identity Card issued.

Refund of Security Deposit

Security deposits are refundable, but payment will be made only on application and after deduction of outstanding dues, if any. If no application's received from a student within three years of leaving the college, the amount shall lapse to the College account.

FACILITIES

Library

The SSN College Library initially was set up in 1967 with the basic objectives of building up a comprehensive collection of science(s), Commerce, Humanities, and Social Sciences. It supports the teaching, research, and extension programs of the College. All students, faculty members, and employees of the College are entitled to make use of the library facilities by taking library membership. The library has a huge collection of interdisciplinary subjects like Chemistry, Biochemistry, Physics, Economics, Mathematics, Political Science, History, Botany, Microbiology, Business Studies, etc., and offers library services through its various divisions. There are approximately 1,11,300 books in the library at present and about 4,000 books are added every year. The library subscribesto more than 56 national and international journals and periodicals and 24 newspapers which provide the latest information on current events and affairs. The library has a rich collection of books on science (s), for example, Botany, Chemistry, Computer Science Economics, Mathematics, Physics, Chemical Engineering, Electrical, and Electronics Engineering, Biochemical and Biomedical Engineering, etc. Social Sciences include Economics, History, Political Science, Public Administration and so on. A separate library on Commerce and other interdisciplinary subjects is also housed in a separate building of our college. The SSNC Library provides the following services/facilities: Reading Room Services, Circulation Services including Inter-Library Loan Services, Reference and Referral Services, Photocopying

Services (Outside the library), User Guidance Services, Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC), Ex-employee membership, and E-resources (in the e-resources lab).



Games and Sports



Department of Physical Education not only takes care of physical but mental, social, emotional, spiritual, and intellectual development provided through physical education, yoga, and sports. The college organizes and participates in various inter-college and inter-varsity sports activities for the students viz. Cricket, Basketball, Volley Ball, Badminton, Table Tennis, Chess, Kabaddi, softball, baseball, Athletics, and many other outdoor and indoor games for boys and girls. Spacious grounds and sports materials are provided liberally to sports enthusiasts. The college holds annual sports meet regularly. Swami Shraddhanand College won the final of the inter-college cricket tournament 2019-20. Swami Shraddhanand College is the champion of the Sahibzada Zorawar Singh T20 tournament defeating the reigning champions AIR INDIA in thefinals. Medical Aid

All the students will be medically examined at least once a year by the College Medical Officer. The students may refer their problems of health to the Medical Officer and get advice. We have a well-equipped medical room witha fully trained nurse to provide necessary first aid to the students in the time of emergency. We also organized health check camps from time to time. Health advisory on the prevention of various illnesses like Corona Virus, Swine flu, dengue, etc. is also a regular feature. Students will be provided first aid only on the premises in case of amedical problem. In case of emergency, the college shall only inform the parents telephonically and they will be expected to reach the college at the earliest.



National Cadet Corps (NCC)

The National Cadet Corpse of the swami Shraddhanand College was started after the establishment of the college campus at Narela.
