DISCIPLINARY CONTROL AND ACADEMIC REGULATIONS

Discipline

Swami Shraddhanand College is committed to maintaining a disciplined, safe, and conducive environment for academic growth. The Proctorial Board and Anti-Ragging Committees play pivotal roles in upholding discipline and ensuring student welfare. These bodies address student grievances and have the authority to adjudicate matters involving breaches of discipline. Students are expected to comply with college rules and regulations. The following behaviours are considered disciplinary infractions:

1. Neglecting assigned tasks and class work.
2. Disrupting classes and causing disturbances.
3. Showing defiance towards teachers or other college authorities.
4. Misconduct within the classroom, including damage to furniture or college property.
5. Inciting others to engage in disruptive or disorderly activities.
6. Shouting and loitering on college premises.
7. Leaving classes without permission.
8. Smoking or drinking within the college premises.
9. Diverting college buses from their designated routes is a serious offence and may lead to strict disciplinary action, including expulsion.
10. Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited as per the University of Delhi Ordinance XV-C, which states:
 - Ragging is strictly banned within the college, the university system, and on public transport.
 - Any individual or collective act of ragging constitutes gross indiscipline and will be dealt with severe punitive measures.
 - Ragging includes:
 - o Physical assault, threats, or the use of force.
 - o Violating the dignity and honour of women students.
 - o Violating the dignity of students belonging to the Scheduled Castes and Tribes.
 - o Acts that expose students to ridicule, contempt, or harm their self-esteem.
 - o Verbal abuse, indecent gestures, or obscene behaviour.

Internal Complaints Committee (ICC)

The Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) is established in accordance with the UGC Regulations, 2015, based on the Government of India's Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition, and Redressal) Act, 2013. LIBRARY

The college library serves as a vital academic resource, fully automated with LIMS and operating on SOUL 3.0 software. It houses a vast collection of over 1,13,647 books, including textbooks, reference materials, general reading, periodicals, and a dedicated Braille section to support inclusive education. The library subscribes to 27 newspapers (with multiple copies) and 24 magazines to keep the academic community well-informed. Users are issued barcoded identity cards for efficient circulation, with borrowing privileges based on user category, and daily usage is recorded through an entrance logbook. A web-based Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC) enables easy and remote access to resources. Through the INFLIBNET N-LIST Consortium and the Delhi University Library System (DULS), students and faculty can access more than 2 lakh e-books and over 6,000 e-journals. Facilities for visually challenged users include assistive technologies and an extensive Braille collection, with future plans to upgrade to RFID-based systems. Library services span both campuses and include reading rooms, circulation and inter-library loan services, reference and referral support, and a dedicated helpdesk. The library also maintains subscriptions to key digital platforms such as e-Shodh Sindhu, e-Shodh Ganga, e-databases, e-journals, and e-books, all of which are accessible remotely. A display board in the reading area highlights the latest arrivals to keep users updated with new additions

National Education Policy (NEP) 2020

The National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 marks a significant shift in India's educational landscape, aiming to create a learner-centered framework that empowers students with the knowledge, skills, and values required to meet the challenges of a rapidly evolving world. Recognizing the crucial role of education in national development, NEP 2020 envisions a holistic, flexible, and multidisciplinary approach to teaching and learning. It emphasizes critical thinking, conceptual clarity, ethical reasoning, and experiential learning. The policy seeks to ensure inclusive and equitable quality education for all while nurturing a deep sense of responsibility towards the nation. It focuses on achieving academic excellence by integrating equity and efficiency in higher education, thereby preparing learners to become competent, responsible citizens of the 21st century.

At the undergraduate level, NEP 2020 introduces a four-year multidisciplinary programme that offers multiple entry and exit options. Students may exit after one year with a certificate (upon earning 48 credits), after two years with a diploma (96 credits), after three years with a bachelor's degree (140 credits), or complete the full four years to earn an honours or research degree (180 credits). This structure supports academic mobility and flexibility while promoting depth in chosen disciplines. The curriculum encourages active student engagement through a credit-based system designed to allow smooth academic progression.

The fourth year of the undergraduate programme is particularly significant as it integrates research-based learning aligned with the student's discipline. Departments and faculty play a crucial role in linking research activities to the taught curriculum, ensuring that these experiences are meaningful, skill-enhancing, and academically enriching. Supported by modern laboratories, a well-established Central Research Facility, and research-oriented faculty, students are guided through hands-on projects, fieldwork, and scientific inquiry, laying a strong foundation for future academic or professional research.

Key features of NEP 2020 at the undergraduate level include the Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) for credit transfer and accumulation, interdisciplinary and multidisciplinary learning, integration of skill development and value-based education, and a multi-exit framework. These reforms are designed to enhance the quality and relevance of higher education in India while fostering lifelong learning and innovation.

Important Points

- The applicant must be a citizen of India.
- The applicant should have passed the Class XII examination of any Board/University in India or any foreign country recognized as equivalent to the 10+2 system by the Association of Indian Universities (AIU).
- The candidate must have studied and passed Class XII Examination or its equivalent from a single recognized board.
- Candidates must appear in CUET in only those subjects in which s(he) has passed Class XII.
- In case the subject studied at Class XII is not mentioned in the CUET, the candidate must appear in a subject that is similar/closely related to the subject s(he) has studied at Class XII.
- Merit will be based only on the 'combination of subjects in which a candidate has appeared in CUET, as mentioned in the respective Program-Specific Eligibility.
- Only the scores obtained in CUET 2025 will be considered for academic year 2025-26 admissions.
- Candidates must appear in CUET in only those subjects in which s(he) has passed Class XII.
- Admissions to all programs will be done through CSAS (UG)-2025
- Applicants with gap year(s) will not be at any disadvantage for admission to undergraduate courses.

Eligibility Requirement for Undergraduate

Common Minimum Eligibility

- The candidate must have passed the Class XII or its equivalent examination from a single recognized board.
- For the purpose of ascertaining the Minimum Eligibility, the marksheet/degree of only one board will be considered. (For example, if a candidate has appeared in CBSE Board Examination with five subjects except for Mathematics and later appears and passes Mathematics from another board such as the National Institute of Open Schooling (NIOS), the minimum eligibility shall be ascertained from his/her mark sheet issued by CBSE only).

Program Specific Eligibilities

RESERVATION POLICIES

Reservation of Seats for Scheduled Caste (SC) and Scheduled Tribe (ST) Candidates

1. 22.5% of the total number of seats is reserved for Candidates belonging to Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribes (15% for Scheduled Caste and 7.5% for Scheduled Tribes, interchangeable if necessary).
2. The Candidate must have a caste/Tribe certificate in their name at the time of Registration and Admission. The Caste certificate should clearly state:
 - Name of his/ her caste/ tribe
 - Whether the candidate belongs to SC or ST
 - District and the State or Union Territory of the Candidate's usual place of residence, and
 - The appropriate Govt. of India Schedule under which his/ her caste/ tribe is approved as SC or ST.

3. Candidates will have to produce a valid original SC or ST caste/tribe certificate at the time of admission. The following are empowered to issue the requisite SC/ST Certificate:

- District Magistrate/ Additional District Magistrate/ Collector/ Deputy Commissioner/ Addl. Deputy Commissioner/ Deputy Collector/ 1st class Stipendiary Magistrate/ City Magistrate/Sub-divisional Magistrate/ Taluka Magistrate/ Executive Magistrate/ Extra Assistant Commissioner.
- Chief Presidency Magistrate/ Addl. Chief Presidency Magistrate/ Presidency Magistrate.
- Revenue Officer, not below the rank of Tehsildar.
- Sub-Divisional Officer of the area where the Candidate and/ or his family normally resides.
- Administrator/ Secretary to the Administrator/ Development Officer (Lakshadweep Islands).

Reservation of Seats for Other Backward Classes (OBC, Non-Creamy Layer, Central List)

1. 27% seats are reserved for Candidates belonging to Other Backward Classes (OBC- Non-Creamy Layer, Central List).
2. At the time of giving admission to an OBC Candidate, the College will ensure that the caste is included in the Central List of OBC (the OBC status is to be determined based on the Central (Govt. of India)). List of OBCs notified by the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment on the recommendations of the National Commission for Backward Classes (available at the website http://ncbc.nic.in/backward_classes/index.html)
3. The certificate must mention the non-creamy layer status of the Candidate (Non-creamy layer status issued by an authority mentioned in DOPT Office Memorandum no. 36012/22/93- Estt. (SCT) dated 15.11.1993).
4. The OBC Candidates who belong to the 'Non-Creamy Layer' and whose caste appears in the Central List of the OBCs only, shall be eligible to be considered for admission under the OBC category (Validity period of OBC certificate in respect of 'non-creamy layer' status of the candidate as per DOPT Office Memorandum No. 36036/2/2013-Estt. (Res- I) dated 31 March 2016). The certificate should be issued on or after 31st March, 2025.

Reservation policy for Economically Weaker Sections (EWS)

- As per the University of Delhi notifications (Reference No. Aca. I/ Reservation of EWSs/ 2019/ 63 Dated 28th March 2019 and Reference No. Aca. I/ Reservation of EWSs / 2019/ 101 Dated 15th May 2019), for the reservation for Economically Weaker Sections (EWSs) Category, the University Departments/ Centres/ Colleges have reserved 10% seats for admission of candidates belonging to the EWS category.
- The certificate should be issued after 31st March, 2025.

Admission to Supernumerary Seats

Admission to all supernumerary seats will be through CUET (UG) 2025. Candidates desirous of taking admission on Supernumerary seats must appear in CUET (UG) 2025.

A. Reservation of Seats for Persons with Benchmark Disabilities (PwBD)

- Five percent (5%) of the total sanctioned strength in each Program is reserved for PwBD candidates.
- Separate Allocation result/s will be declared for candidates seeking admission under the PwBD quota.
- For the format of the PwBD certificate, refer to the Admission website www.admission.uod.ac.in. Disability Certificates issued after 01.06.2021 must be as per the Gazette Notification No. 1736 (E) dated 05.05.2021 issued by the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities and applied through the UDID portal. However, Disability Certificates issued before 01.06.2021 will be considered as per other existing applicable rules and notifications of the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities and the University of Delhi.

Concessional/Waiver of fees in respect of Persons with Benchmark Disabilities (PwBD)

- Candidates with physical disabilities pursuing various programs of study shall be exempted from payment of fees, including examination fee and other University fees, except the Admission fee, subscription towards Delhi University students 'Union, and Identity Card fee (As per amendment to Ordinance X(4) of the University).
- PwBD Candidates who meet the merit for the unreserved category and will take admission in the unreserved category (UR) will pay the fee relevant for PwBD candidates.

B- Reservation for Children/Widows of Personnel of the Armed Forces (CW)

- Five percent (5%) of seats are reserved for Candidates under this category, program-wise. Candidates desirous of taking admission under the CW quota of the University must appear in CUET 2025.
- All such Candidates have to upload the Educational Concession Certificate (ECC) issued by any of the following authorities on the proper letter head: Secretary, Kendriya Sainik Board, Delhi; Secretary, Rajya Zila Sainik Board; Officer-in-Charge, Record Office; 1st Class Stipendiary Magistrate; Ministry of Home Affairs (For Police Personnel in receipt of Gallantry Awards)
- No other format shall be permissible. Proofs of the CW category in the form of an ID card of parent or dependent, Medical card, Ration card, CSD card, etc., are not admissible instead of a certificate in the correct format. The priority must be mentioned in the certificate. Certificates that do not mention the relevant priority will not be considered.

C- Reservation of Kashmiri Migrants (KM)

- Up to 5% seats are reserved program-wise for the wards of Kashmiri Migrants.
- All the wards of Kashmiri Migrants will have to upload a certificate of registration as Kashmiri Migrants issued by the Divisional Commissioner/Relief Commissioner.
- Candidates desirous of taking admission under the Kashmiri Migrants quota must appear in CUET (UG) - 2025.

D- Prime Minister's Special Scholarship Scheme for J&K students

Candidates desirous of taking admission under the Prime Minister's Special Scholarship Scheme for J&K students must appear in CUET 2025.

E- Ward Quota of Employees of the University of Delhi

- Candidates desirous of taking admission under the Ward Quota of Employees of the University of Delhi must appear in CUET 2025.
- Admission to the wards of the University and its College employees, both teaching and non-teaching, will be done as per Academic Council resolution 9a & 9b dated 27.11.2020 and subsequent amendments thereof.
- Candidates must have a valid Employment Certificate issued by the relevant officials at the time of admission.
- Only the Employment certificate uploaded at the time of registration will be considered. I-cards, Aadhar Card, and/or any other document will not be accepted.

F- Orphans Quota (OQ)

- Candidates desirous of taking admission under the supernumerary Quota for Orphans must appear in CUET (UG) - 2025.
- The University of Delhi will be admitting two candidates (one male and one female) in each program of study. These two seats will be supernumerary.
- A candidate who wishes to seek admission under the orphan's quota must possess a certificate from a Govt. recognized Orphanage/Charitable Home or a Death certificate of both parents.
- As per University Notification No. Acad. I/Orphan Quota/2024-25/10 dated 16th January 2024 - Candidates seeking admission with effect from the Academic Session 2024-25 onwards under the Orphan Quota shall pay the following fees:-
 - Admission Fee - Rs. 10.00
 - Examination Fee - Rs. 10.00

G- Extra-Curricular Activities (ECA) and Sports Quota

- Candidates desirous of taking admission under the supernumerary quota for ECA and/or Sports must appear in CUET 2025.
- For admissions to ECA and Sports supernumerary seats, a weightage of 25% will be given to CUET score and 75% to certificates/trials/performances.

H- Single Girl Child Quota (SGC)

- 01 (One) seat in each Program of every college is reserved under the Supernumerary Quota for a single girl child.
- The parent or guardian (if parents are deceased) must declare that the girl child is the only child and that there is no other male or female child in the family. This declaration is required for admission under the "Single Girl Child" category for the academic session 2025-26.
- A copy of an affidavit confirming this must be uploaded during online registration.
- The affidavit must be duly attested by one of the following authorities (not below the rank of 1st Class Stipendiary Magistrate): District Magistrate / Additional Magistrate; Deputy Commissioner / Collector / Additional Deputy Commissioner; Deputy Collector / 1st Class Stipendiary Magistrate; City Magistrate / Sub-Divisional Magistrate; Taluka Magistrate / Executive Magistrate; Extra Assistant Commissioner
- The original affidavit must be produced at the time of physical document verification.

Students Aid Fund

The objective of this fund is to render financial assistance to deserving students to enable them to deposit their tuition/ examination fees or to purchase books. It also runs a Book Bank having 10,000 books which are lent to the students on loan.

Fee Concession and Prizes

- Fee concession is given to a few students on the basis of merit and individual needs.
- Students belonging to the Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes are awarded scholarships by the Ministry of Education. Such students are required to apply to “The Secretary, Scheduled Castes/Tribes and the Backward Classes Board, Govt. of India” on prescribed form, through the principal, immediately after joining the college.
- Prizes are given to students for academic distinction in University Examinations and for distinguished performance in debates and other cultural activities. College sports colours are awarded to sportsmen winning distinction at inter-college meets.

PM-Vidyalaxmi

An initiative under the Pradhan Mantri Vidya Lakshmi Karyakram, aimed at empowering students with financial support for higher education. This national portal offers a single-window platform for students to access information about education loans, apply to multiple banks, and track their applications seamlessly. For undergraduate students at the University of Delhi, PM-VidyaLaxmi provides a valuable opportunity to pursue academic aspirations without financial constraints, promoting inclusive and equitable access to quality education.

Internal Assessment

It will be based on Class test, assignment & attendance. At least 67% attendance is compulsory for appearing in theory exams.

Identity Card

Every student will be issued an Identity Card. The students are required to keep their Identity Cards and produce the same on demand. Students will have to deposit the Identity Card to the college office while claiming back their securities. In case of loss of Identity Card, the students shall have to deposit Rs.100, and produce a copy of the FIR from the concerned Police Station and also submit an affidavit to this effect for getting a duplicate Identity Card issued.

Refund of Security Deposit

Security deposits are refundable, but payment will be made only on application and after deduction of outstanding dues, if any. If no application is received from a student within three years of leaving the college, the amount shall lapse to the College account.

FACILITIES

Library



The college library serves as a vital academic resource, fully automated with LIMS and operating on SOUL 3.0 software. It houses a vast collection of over 1,13,647 books, including textbooks, reference materials, general reading, periodicals, and a dedicated Braille section to support inclusive education. The library subscribes to 27 newspapers (with multiple copies) and 24 magazines to keep the academic community well-informed. Users are issued barcoded identity cards for efficient circulation, with borrowing privileges based on user category, and daily usage is recorded through an entrance logbook. A web-based Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC) enables easy and remote access to resources. Through the INFLIBNET N-LIST Consortium and the Delhi University Library System (DULS), students and faculty can access more than 2 lakh e-books and over 6,000 e-journals. Facilities for visually challenged users include assistive technologies and an extensive Braille collection, with future plans to upgrade to RFID-based systems. Library services span both campuses and include reading rooms, circulation and inter-library loan services, reference and referral support, and a dedicated help desk. The library also maintains subscriptions to key digital platforms such as e-Shodh Sindhu, e-Shodh Ganga, e-databases, e-journals, and e-books, all of which are accessible remotely. A display board in the reading area highlights the latest arrivals to keep users updated with new additions

The Department of Physical and Sports Education at Swami Shraddhanand College is a centre of sporting excellence within the University of Delhi. It has consistently produced top-performing athletes who have excelled in university, national, and international competitions. Notable alumni like Harshit Rana, Priyansh Arya, and Anuj Rawat have represented major IPL teams and the Indian national side, with Harshit Rana recently selected for all three formats of international cricket, including the Border-Gavaskar Trophy. The college boasts a strong legacy in cricket, with the team winning 12 consecutive Inter College titles. The Sports Society actively promotes physical education, wellness, and leadership through structured training, expert mentorship, and wide participation in inter-college and inter-university competitions across cricket, kabaddi, volleyball, badminton, table tennis, and athletics. It offers students an ideal platform for holistic growth, discipline, and professional sports development.

Medical Aid



The college is committed to ensuring the health and well-being of its students. All students undergo a mandatory medical examination at least once a year, conducted by the College Medical Officer. Students are encouraged to consult the Medical Officer for any health-related concerns and seek appropriate advice. The college has a well-equipped medical room staffed by a trained nurse, capable of providing immediate first aid in case of emergencies. Regular health check-up camps are organised to promote preventive healthcare among students. Additionally, the college provides health advisories on the prevention of various illnesses, including Coronavirus, Swine Flu, Dengue, and other communicable diseases, as part of its ongoing health awareness initiatives. It is important to note that only first aid will be provided on the college premises in case of a medical issue. In emergencies, the college will promptly inform the parents by telephone, and they will be expected to reach the college at the earliest.

National Cadet Corps

The National Cadet Corps (NCC) at Swami Shraddhanand College was established following the inception of the college campus at Narela. Guided by the motto 'Unity and Discipline', the NCC at our college serves as one of the strongest unifying forces in the nation, bringing together youth from diverse backgrounds and shaping them into disciplined, secular, and responsible citizens.
