It was established in 1967 and is a constituent college of the University of Delhi. True to its motto, "ShraddhawanLabte Gyanam", the college propagates the idea that those who are dedicated are the recipients of true knowledge. Indeed, there is an incessant endeavour to inculcate dedication and discipline in the 4,500 students of the college as every student is extremely significant as future nation-builders. The primary focus of the 17 departments of humanities, Commerce, and Science is the proliferation of the egalitarian concept of education for all without any hierarchal dispositions. - Visits to orphanages and divyangjan (disabled home) to celebrate festivals and National days.
- Participated in outreach activities such as cloth donations, hygiene awareness, child education, during difficult times (as in COVID-19), training for disaster management and road safety.
- Awareness programs among students to learn and earn scheme.
- Well-operated three sanitary pad vending machine.
- Voter awareness campaign as per guidelines of the Election Commission of India.

Overall Observations:

Institutional Strengths:

- Only college in the University of Delhi which offers the course of BSc Applied Life Science with Agrochemicals and Pest Management, since it is an application-based course and therefore holds special significance for those who exhibit a keen interest in agriculture or have agricultural background.
- The Accounts and Administrative staff are well-versed in computer skills.
- The library is automated which houses 1,12,953 books.
- The college excels in sports facilities and gives training to the students in different games. Honing the skills of budding cricketers is SSNC's distinctive attribute and no wonder, many of our students have played at both National and International levels in cricket.
- The labs, seminar hall and some of the classrooms are ICT-enabled. The laboratories
 are well-equipped. The rooms as well as the labs are well-lit and ventilated.
- The college has switched to solar energy as its primary source of energy which is indeed an eco-friendly alternative.
- The large amphitheatre of the college is effectively used for organising programmes at minimal expenditure (except in unfavourable seasons).
- Well-operated three sanitary pad vending machines in the new and old building girls'
 washroom and also in the new building staffroom.
- SSNC is the largest IGNOU study centre in Northern India in terms of student enrolment.
- PG accommodation is available close to the college in the Alipur area which provides
 residential facilities to the students and faculty members who are from outside Delhi.
- The college is under CCTV surveillance.
- There are canteen, bank and photocopy shop within the campus.
- · SSNC-NSS and NCC units are quite active.
- It is well connected by bus service and is close to the National Highway.

Institutional Weaknesses:

- The college has two campuses, so it becomes sometime difficult to coordinate with the students for extra-curricular and co-curricular activities.
- Since the main library, examination branch, administrative block and accounts section
 are situated in the new building, the access to these facilities is prominent in the new
 building only.

- The college lacks funds for conducting in-house research projects.
- There is a need for an auditorium in the campus and more rooms to accommodate all
 the courses in a single campus.

Institutional Opportunities:

- SSNC provides opportunities for holistic development through the participation of students in different societies like Lensation, Aina, Rivayat etc.
- The Eco-friendly Green campus initiatives have been introduced from time to time to build a symbiotic relationship between nature and humans for a more harmonious coexistence.
- The college follows 'Optimal Utilization of Resources' by providing learning platforms to students of IGNOU and SOL.
- Special emphasis has been laid to improve the skills of the learners by giving more
 options in skill-based courses.
- It is one of the six colleges of DU which offers the course on Microbiology Hons, and is the only college that offers BSc. in Agrochemicals and Pest Management.
- The college trains the students in different sports where cricket is its forte.
- Students are encouraged to join NCC and NSS.

Institutional Challenges:

- The admission process of college continues till the last round so completing the syllabus of the 1stYear is a challenge.
- It is difficult to reduce the rate of migration of students to other colleges.
- The student strength as compared to the sanctioned seats is reducing which may be due to the Post Covid effectand change in the admission process at the University level.
- Due to the lack of an auditorium, it is difficult to organize big events in the Seminar Hall.
- The student progression data is very difficult to retrieve unless each department seriously finds a solution for it and works towards it.

Recommendations:

- More use of ICT tools in teaching-learning.
- Adopt a research culture among teachers and students.
- Enhance Skill development programs in college.
- Conduct quality-related activities under IQAC.
- To increase number of start Add-on courses, MOOC, NTPEL and certificate courses in the college.

- More emphasis on social activities to ensure the involvement of the maximum number of students.
- Promote in-house research projects
